fire safety guidelines

Greenbelt works hard to ensure that the festival is safe for everyone to enjoy. As part of this, we ask that you comply with the guidelines below and bring this leaflet with you to the Festival.

Understanding the tape markings on the campsite

Firebreaks denoted by red & white marker tape.

Roadways denoted by yellow & black marker tape.

Camping

A minimum distance of 3 metres (10') must separate all tents/ caravans/motor homes (side wall to side wall) with the exception of families and youth groups, where the parents and children's tents can be 1.5m (5') apart. Gazebos are permitted. Please do not camp inside a firebreak.

All caravans/motor homes must be sited on the edge of a roadway, or next to a firebreak with the hitch/ bonnet facing the tape or roadway.

Please keep to the central walkways on the campsite to avoid trip hazards.



BBQs and candles

BBQs and household candles are allowed, if placed in a suitable container, with an extinguisher (or water) close by (please don't use the fire buckets). Please don't place disposable BBQs on the grass or on formica-type tabletops. Open fires are not permitted.

Gas cylinders

Do not change any gas cylinders while there is another stove or naked light in use. Always ensure the hose between gas bottle and apparatus is in good condition, with secure fittings in place at each end of the hose. If using a primus stove, do not over-pressurise and always ensure the lid to the fluid is put on immediately after use and before attempting to light the apparatus. Please ensure a reasonable distance (at least 30cm) between stove and windbreak and never leave any apparatus unattended.

Rubbish and Recycling

Please safely dispose of your used BBQ and gas cylinders and separate your recyclable waste from any

general rubbish and place it in the appropriately marked bins.

Vehicles

Once unpacked, all vehicles need to be moved to one of the designated car parks for the rest of the weekend.

It is strictly prohibited to leave a vehicle in a fire lane (on the campsite this means roadway). Failure to adhere to this warning may result in your vehicle being towed and could put lives at risk. Greenbelt Festivals does not accept any responsibility or liability for any loss or damage caused to a vehicle towed or moved as a result of the failure to adhere to this warning. Any relocation of motor vehicles is entirely at the owners' risk.

Fire and alarm points

On arrival, check to see where your nearest fire point is. (There should be one no further than 90m from where you have chosen to camp). Please do not use these as rubbish dumps, as they must be kept clear at all times. Your nearest alarm point will be no further than 200m from where you have chosen to camp. These should only be used

as means of warning others that there is a problem in the immediate vicinity. Never activate an alarm unless it is necessary to do so.

In the event of fire:

- **Raise the alarm**
- **Make contact with a steward (wearing yellow hi-visibility jackets)**
- **Call the Fire Team on 01242 513776 (to be used for emergencies only)**

If you are involved in a tent fire. Get yourself and all other members of your party out as quickly as possible. Only tackle the fire if you feel safe doing so. You must summon assistance from the onsite emergency services, no matter how small the incident is, or even if it has already been dealt with.

Please remember, if you require any further fire safety advice while at the Festival, or if you are unsure about any of the above, don't hesitate to ask one of the many fire-fighters patrolling the campsites for assistance.
