



ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

This year, 2021, for the second year in a row, we won't be producing the full-blown Greenbelt Festival. However (unlike in 2020 when we were all digital), we are able to stage two small camping gatherings that we're calling 'Prospect Farm'. Because Prospect Farm isn't Greenbelt Festival, it's important that – even if you're a festival regular – you read this essential information about the gatherings carefully.



Outside of these areas there is **NO ACCESS** at any time

Please read the whole of this essential information leaflet for further details about camping at Prospect Farm.



Please do not camp outside of the designated areas. There are two camping areas at Prospect Farm:

Camping area (for tents only) – including general camping, pre-booked deaf and disabled camping, and Camplight (pre-pitched hire tents).

Caravan area (for caravans, motorhomes, camper vans and trailer tents) – including pre-booked deaf and disabled caravan spaces.

Vehicles are **NOT** permitted into the camping areas / field. If you are camping in tents, on arrival, please park your car in the designated car parking area as directed by the stewards and then make your way to the campsite.

Please note: If you told us you have access needs when you booked your ticket, you will be contacted about deaf and disabled camping. If you didn't let us know, but require access to deaf and disabled camping, please email gbinfo@greenbelt.org.uk with your name and booking reference before 20th Aug.



COVID-19 INFORMATION

You'll be able to join us at the farm without having to prove your COVID or vaccine status at the gate. All you need to get through the turnstile is love in your heart and adventure on your mind. (Oh, and a ticket.)

Having said that, we know you're a community-focussed bunch and will want to play your part in looking out for the well-being of everyone. So, we ask you take a COVID test before you leave for Prospect Farm*; not just for your own peace of mind but to safeguard the Greenbelt community. If the worst happens, and you test positive for COVID, please do not come to the site. Instead, email gbinfo@greenbelt.org.uk to let us know you won't be attending.

And, even if you test negative (LFT) but you have COVID-related symptoms, we'd urge you not to come.

The team running the event will be testing regularly – as you would expect. Because the show must go on, and we're determined to deliver Prospect Farm as safely as possible for all those who've bought tickets and our

team behind the scenes.

We will, of course, have handwashing sinks at all the utility points, as well as sanitiser dispensers across the site, but, you may want to bring your own bottle of hand sanitiser with you too.

Every Prospecter has the freedom to choose whether to wear a mask and observe social distancing or not. And while we won't be asking you to do either in any official capacity, we do ask that you respect other people's decisions and needs. Which, to be honest, we know you will. It's what you – what Greenbelt – does best.

**In asking you to take a test we are not then expecting you to bring the result of your negative test to site with you.*

TRAVELLING TO PROSPECT FARM

Just as with the full-blown festival, how our ticket-buyers travel to and from the event is the biggest contributing factor to our carbon footprint. Public transport is, of course, the greenest option. But we get that – especially for those in family groups and with all their camping kit with them this is not really a viable option.

Travelling by train

We are not running a shuttle bus this year from Kettering station up to the site and so you would need to catch a taxi from the station (or get a friend to pick you up).

Travelling by bike

For those coming by bike, there will be somewhere to lock your bike.

Drop off

If you're being dropped off at the festival, there is temporary car parking available as part of our car-parking onsite, with a maximum wait of 30 mins.

There are toilets positioned near to the carpark on your arrival.

Travelling by car

Prospect Farm is taking place in the grounds of Boughton Estate close to the house. As we are not operating a full-blown festival event there will not be the usual AA signs up on public highways until you get very close to the campsite. So **please make sure you have a SatNav or Googlemaps and the directions below to hand.**

Please follow the instructions below and do not approach the Estate via any other routes as this will cause you unnecessary delay.


Please exit the A14 at Junction 12. **If you are using a SatNav** you can use the postcode: **NN14 3AG** until you **exit the A14 at junction 12**. After that, please follow the instructions below:

1. Once you have turned off at J12 of the A14 please follow your Satnav/signs to the village of Slipton. On entering the village, you will pass the Samuel Pepys pub on your right-hand side. Continue through the village on

the same road (called Slipton Lane).

2. Continue out of the village on Slipton Lane for 1.6 miles to the crossroads. Continue straight across at the crossroads (ignore the signpost pointing right to Boughton House).

3. Continue on the same road for another half a mile and you will see the Prospect Farm signage, directing you to turn right off the road and onto the Boughton Estate trackway. Please then follow the Prospect Farm signage all the way into the main car park.



Please note: There are no facilities to queue or wait on the roadside before you access the site. So, please do not arrive before 12 noon on Monday 23 August for the Weekday gathering or 12 noon on Friday 27 August for the Weekend gathering. (Under the terms of our contract with the estate we cannot let you turn off the road and into the estate before those times.)

ARRIVALS / ENTRY TO PROSPECT FARM

Boughton House Estate is private property. The area of the estate being used by Greenbelt for Prospect Farm will be accessible to Prospectors (Prospect Farm ticket-holders) from 12 noon on Monday 23 August for the Weekday Gathering and 12 noon on Friday 27 August for the Weekend Gathering.

There will be a welcome session for all Prospectors towards the end of the afternoon on the respective arrival days (Monday 23 or Friday 27 August).

E-TICKETS AND WRISTBAND EXCHANGE

When you buy your Prospect Farm ticket in advance you will receive an e-ticket via email (3 days before the event) that you must print and bring with you. We will NOT dispatch wristbands by post ahead of Prospect Farm.

For advance purchasers, whether camping or coming in for the day, you will exchange your e-tickets for Prospect Farm wristbands at the Wristband Exchange caravan on your way to the campsite.

Wristbands lost or removed from your wrist or tampered with will be

rendered invalid and you will be required to purchase a replacement.

Please use a permanent marker to write a contact number on children's wristbands. In the event that your child becomes separated from you, we can then contact the designated parent/guardian.

OTHER PASSES

Car parking

Car-parking is included in your Prospect Farm ticket price this year and so there is no need for you to purchase and print out car-parking passes.

Campervan/caravan passes

If you are bringing a caravan, motorhome, camper van or trailer tent to the festival you will need a Campervan Field Pass. This will be emailed to you as an e-ticket to print out.

Please display this pass in the windscreen of your car (or campervan / motorhome) on arrival so that the stewards can direct you to a pitch in the designated caravan area / field.

Please note: Only purpose built and professionally adapted sleeping accommodation will be permitted into the caravan/campervan field. Sleeping in cars and vans

is not permitted for safety reasons.

Once you have positioned your caravan or trailer tent, please move your car promptly to the car park.

Your caravan/campervan should be no longer than nine metres. If you have purchased a Campervan Plus pass, one small 'pup tent' or awning is permitted next to your caravan/camper van.

You cannot book a caravan/campervan pass to use for a tent in the caravan field. They are for caravans, motorhomes, campervans and trailer tents only. Anyone attempting to do so will be required to move to the Camping Area / Field.

Power should be drawn from a separate battery and not your car battery, as your vehicle will not be permitted to stay next to your caravan, campervan or trailer tent. There are no electrical hook-ups available in the main body of the caravan/campervan field.

Portable toilets will be available in the caravan/campervan field, along with Elsan points.

BARROWS

Push your own rainbow barrow.

Get-ins

(Mon 23 and Fri 27 from noon)
Pick up a barrow in the carpark, transport your stuff across to the campsite and then drop off your barrow to the drop-off point by Kindred Cafe.

Get outs

(Thurs 26 and Mon 30 before 12 noon)
Pick up a barrow in The Yard / Kindred Cafe, transport your stuff back out to the carpark and then drop off your barrow to the drop-off point in the carpark.

FOOD & TRADERS

There will be food vendors onsite serving drinks, snacks and hot/cold meals. We would love for you to support them after such a tough year and a half. But, please do also bring your own food with you, too, as there will be no 'site shop' to stock up on supplies and fewer caterers compared to a 'normal' festival year. Here are the food traders that will be joining us at the farm:

The Tiny Tea Tent is a warm and friendly place to meet people, chill out, and enjoy a classically refreshing mug of tea (of all varieties).

Greenbelt favourite **Lalita's** will be offering delicious South Indian food, all of which is vegan and gluten free.

Kindred Café will be offering a full section of breakfast items, plus lunchtime meals and snacks and a selection of cakes. In the evening the dinner menu will include family favourite hot meals, fresh soups and wood fired pizzas cooked fresh on site in a specialist pizza oven.

CAMPSITE RULES

Safety

Camping space is available on a first-come, first-served basis in the main camping area / field. To ensure that everyone has fair access to the camping area, reserving space is not permitted (with the exception of pre-bookable Disabled Camping).

Routeways for authorised emergency and service vehicles are denoted by striped marker tape. Please do not camp in these areas.

A minimum distance of 1.5m must separate all tents and gazebos.

Remember, the campsite is a public space and the security of your accommodation cannot be guaranteed. We recommend leaving your valuables at home and reporting any suspicious activities immediately to stewards.

Fire safety

We permit: Camping stoves – please place off the ground with an extinguisher or water close by.

We do not permit: Personal generators, open fires, disposable barbecues or sky lanterns.

Please do not change any gas cylinders in your tent, or while there is another stove or naked light in use nearby and always check the new cylinder is securely fitted before using. Please ensure a reasonable distance (at least 60cm) between stove and windbreak and never leave any apparatus unattended.

If you are involved in a tent fire, get yourself and all other members of your party out as quickly as possible. Only tackle the fire if you feel safe doing so. You must summon assistance from the stewards, no matter how small the incident is, or even if it has already been dealt with. If you require any further fire safety advice at Prospect Farm, or if you are unsure about any of the above, don't hesitate to ask one of the stewards.

In the event of fire or a medical emergency:
– Raise the alarm
– Make contact with a steward (wearing yellow hi-visibility jackets) and make sure you can describe the location of the fire or emergency.

Child safety

Those of you who are familiar with the festival will know that – in a normal year – we have a team of volunteers who are dedicated to helping found children get back to their communities. As this year is not a festival, we will not have that team. So we ask you to be extra vigilant when supervising children, especially around high-risk areas of the site, such as the waterways.

Please use a permanent marker to write a contact number on children's wristbands. In the event that your child becomes separated from you, we can then contact the designated parent/guardian.

OTHER CAMPSITE INFORMATION

Utilities

Cold water standpipes are situated throughout the campsite. These are suitable for drinking. There will also be sink units for washing your hands. Toilets are also located throughout the site.

Rubbish

We will provide waste bags for you this year to have at your pitches – one for your recyclables, one for other waste. Before you depart you should bring these bags to the designated points

and deposit them in the appropriate pens.

The Yard

This is situated in the main campsite area / field. You'll find all the venues and food and drink outlets here.

Showers

These are located next to The Yard. Your Prospect Farm ticket gives you free access to the showers. There are not many of them and they are not bookable. There will be a disabled shower available for those with disabilities only.

Lighting

Please bring a torch, as Boughton Estate is in a rural area and the campsite fields will be very dark at night. (Much darker than for the full-blown festival when we string festoon lighting throughout the campsite but better for star gazing.)

Leave no trace

As Prospectors, please help to ensure you leave no trace of your visit. Please continue to be particularly vigilant about small items such as tent pegs, which can be hazardous to animals.

Money

We recommend bringing cash with you as there are no cash machines onsite and card payments might be unreliable.

SUPPORT FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

We aim to make the campsite as accessible as possible with facilities such as a wheelchair recharging area, and a specialist shower unit, but please note that as this is not a festival we will not be providing The Haven respite venue. We offer designated camping spaces for disabled people – as individuals or with family or friends. If you would like to camp in these areas it is essential to pre-book.

If you notified us that you have access requirements when you booked, our Access team will have already been in touch with you, and will have checked if you want to pre-book designated camping spaces.

If you have not yet let us know about your access requirements, please contact us on gbinfo@greenbelt.org.uk as soon as possible with your name and booking reference. It is much easier for us to arrange support for your needs ahead of the campsite rather than onsite, so please do contact us by 18th August at the latest.

GENERAL

Information

Is available at the Prospect Farm Info Caravan in The Yard.

Mobile phones

Phone charging is not available at Prospect Farm (unlike at a full-blown Greenbelt Festival). We'd suggest that you bring your own solar / battery charging equipment with you or use Prospect Farm as an opportunity to be away from your phones for a couple of days. After all, the rural location means mobile phone signal is patchy anyway and there will be limited coverage across all networks.

Alcohol

There is a designated Beer Tent (The Jesus Arms) within the Yard where alcohol may be purchased and consumed. Alcohol may be consumed in the campsite and caravan/campervan field, but you will not be able to bring your own alcohol into The Yard. Greenbelt operates a Challenge 25 policy, so if you're lucky enough to look under 25, please bring appropriate ID.

Pets

Animals are not permitted at Prospect Farm. Only assistance dogs registered with organisations recognised by Assistance Dogs UK are permitted.
