INSTANT ANGEL

CARRIE Today we are celebrating fifty years of Greenbelt. We have

commissioned Greenbelter and digital artist Emma Major to help us create a unique angelic artwork for this Sunday morning, filled with

our prayers of thanks. Here's Emma to explain it to us.

VIDEO [Emma Major video]

Hi. I'm Emma Major, and I'm a Greenbelter just like you. I'm not well enough to be there this year, but it's an honour that Greenbelt have asked me to create a piece of art for our prayer in worship this morning. I'm a digital artist, and I create using my iPad down to almost one pixel in quality, and I have created a piece of art

prayerfully, with God guiding me as I go. And you are going to bring

this piece of art to life.

Now those of you who have been to Greenbelt many times will know that there's a brown paper bag in your group or near you somewhere. Take a look to your left or your right and you will find a brown paper bag in a group that you can join. I'll give you a few seconds to find your nearest one join that group for our activity.

I need you, whoever is in charge of that brown paper bag to empty it out. And inside you will find a piece of tissue paper much like this. It may be red, yellow, blue or green. And there are enough pieces of tissue paper for every single one of you here. That means the one year olds get one, and the ninety-one year olds get one, and everyone in between. And if it's a bit windy, as it is here today, you might need to hold it between two hands.

This piece of tissue paper is where we're going to focus our prayers this morning. And we're going to give prayers of thanks, of joy, of hope — thanking God for the way he's been with us in our lives; giving thanks for those moments of joy we've noticed; giving thanks for how even in the hardest times we have not been alone. And we're going to capture those prayers, and we're going to gather them together into our tissue paper until we make a flower. Every single one that you create will be different; as different as I am to you and you are to the people sitting around you. And they are perfectly made; full of the prayers of hope and thanks.

And these flowers of prayer we're going to gather, and we're going to make a piece of art. And to do that you're going to place your flower into the brown bag which the tissue paper came from. So let's all find our local bag. Place our flower full of prayers into that, and then we're going to pass it forward, where an amazing team of people are going to bring our prayers to life in a piece of art that will be revealed to you later.

[People in the crowd will have time to pray and collect tissue paper flowers, which are brought to the front in bags. We may need David to encourage or remind people. If so, please add the following.] When you have folded your prayers of thanks into a tissue paper flower, please put all the flowers from your group back into the brown paper bag. Then as we sing our next song, please pass the bags to the front of the stage.

Yesterday a group of Greenbelters met to read a passage from the Bible together. This is the passage we read, from Luke's gospel, chapter 8.

[PAUSE as groups share bread and juice. After a short pause Stephen begins the song Speak Up. Introduce by saying it was written with/for

Christian Aid]

Rise up, rise up use your power (x 3)

Rise for justice now

GIVE

CARRIE Now we are moving into the third act of our worship – giving.

DAVID We are meeting at a time when many people in the UK are feeling

insecure and fearful about the future. We're tempted to keep what we have, to guard our borders, to look inwards, and to hedge against

a scary future.

CARRIE But in God's economy things work differently. It's all gift. So in our

third act we're going to ask what is Greenbelt's gift to the world?

DAVID What have we been given, as individuals and together as a

community? What do we as a community want to give away? We're not just talking about money here, but hope, beauty, vision for the life of the world. And not just today at the festival either, but in the next

50 days, 50 months, 50 years?

CARRIE On the edge of your service sheet is a detachable slip. If you like, you

could use it to remind of something that has come to you as a gift from God – and what God is calling you to do. You could put it in your Bible, or on your computer screen or on a mirror – wherever you look most often(!) – to remind you of all that we have been given, and all

that we have to give.

[Music starts: Freely, freely]

DAVID At the very first Greenbelt festival at Prospect Farm in 1974 we all

sang a new song that had only just been written. It was based on the words of Jesus in Matthew chapter 10: Freely you have received, freely

give.

We will keep a period of quiet as the band sing that fifty year-old song to us. And as we do, let's open ourselves to God to speak to us about the things we have been given: houses, money, voices, connections, time and so much more. What have we been given? What will we

give? Let's pray.

DAVID What is God calling Greenbelt to give to the world?

One of the ways we can give is through money. Over the fifty years of this beautiful gathering, Greenbelters have released around a million pounds through our communion offerings. This year we are sticking with the fifty theme for our communion giving. We're going fifty/fifty.

Fifty percent of what you give today will be used by Greenbelt to keep this show on the road and to keep the festival as accessible as we can in these challenging times.

The other fifty percent we're going to give away – in a four-way split reflecting our consistent campaigning and programming focusses during our time at Boughton House.

CARRIE

DAVID

Our four campaigning focusses are migration, climate change, poverty and inequality in the UK, and Palestine-Israel. So the fifty percent we give away will be divided between four different causes.

We'll give to Citizens UK – to bolster their work on the 'Homes for Ukraine' work we're so proud to be supporting this weekend, but also, importantly, their wider work on community sponsorship schemes to welcome Afghan and Syrian refugees to the UK.

We'll give to Christian Aid and their work in [

We'll give to the brand new anti-poverty movement, launched here this weekend by the Methodist Church, comprising a broad coalition of the UK's anti-poverty agencies and church denominations, including Trussell Trust, Christians Against Poverty, Church Action on Poverty and many more.

And we'll give to the Amos Trust, who will be staging an ambitious and high profile visual arts exhibition of 'On Location' in London next year, showcasing the work of wonderful Gazan artists working under blockade and occupation – an expression of 'beautiful resistance'.

Please give as generously as you feel able to mark this special fiftieth anniversary of the festival.
